



As part of our rebrand, we aligned 100% of our curriculum and assessments to specific historical thinking skills. Through Thinking Nation, educators can measure student success based on these skills, rather than merely on students' content knowledge. Having these icons embedded throughout our curriculum reminds students what to focus on to master the disciplines within social studies.



In December 2023, Thinking Nation transitioned our grading model to generative Al. Al transforms education by saving teachers valuable time and giving them the data they need to drive learning forward. Teachers can act on data *in the moment* in order to provide students with the support they need to flourish.

Integrating AI into our online platform both benefits our partner schools and ensures a more sustainable model for our organization. Due to AI, we are able to maintain low costs for our partners, provide higher quality support for teachers, and expand without compromising consistency. Our mission is to empower students. 





conferences where Thinking Nation presented and/or exhibited The 2023-2024 fiscal year, in many ways, was defined by growth for the organization. During the year, we hired our fifth full time employee, and secured enough school contracts to hire our sixth at the beginning of fiscal year 2024-2025.

Organizational growth and an expanding team means that more students around the country are being empowered to think deeply about the world around them.

At Thinking Nation, we acknowledge that we cannot empower students without a paradigm shift in the social studies field. Isolated progress rarely brings systemic change. This is why much of our work centers on equipping teachers through professional development and designing curriculum that enhances collaboration and alignment.

The statistics on this page highlight this focus. But an example from one of our partner schools may better illustrate this vision coming to life.

Birmingham Community Charter High School serves more than 3,000 students, making it one of the largest charter schools in the country. The large social studies department was looking for ways to better align across their content areas and have tools to collaborate with each other. Thinking Nation's online platform, Al grading, and common tools have supported this work.

Now, the social studies department has goals for each grade level and the whole department. Through Thinking Nation, they can track progress In these goals from the data reports they receive from our platform. Teachers collaborate more, students practice deep thinking and writing more, and the culture of the department has become much stronger.

Supporting schools in this way is why we exist at Thinking Nation. When we support teachers like this, we empower students with the skills and dispositions they need for success.
